Mary Washington House pre-1772 1200 Charles Street Mary Ball Washington spent the last seventeen years of her life in this comfortable home, bought for her by her son, George Washington.

Rising Sun Tavern c. 1760 1304 Caroline Street Built by Charles Washington around 1760 as his home, this building was later operated as a tavern in the bustling port town of Fredericksburg.

Hugh Mercer Apothecary Shop c. 1772 1020 Caroline Street An 18th century building restored as the Hugh Mercer Apothecary Shop provides a vivid living history interpretation of colonial medical practices.

St. James' House c. 1772 1300 Charles Street This small, gambrel-roofed house is a fine example of an 18th century gentleman's house. It contains a collection of period furnishings including silver, glass, and porcelain. Your Special Event at Washington Heritage Museums
